This list replaces all previous Africana lists and constitutes a complete listing of the Africa-related items I currently have for sale. I'm in the process of reducing my stock in this area, operating under considerable duress from She Who Must Be Obeyed as regards space issues, clutter, and the like. I suspect many of you will understand.

Africana continues to be highly collectible, and there are many choice titles, not to mention plenty of obscure ones, offered below. This is a new, entirely revised list, with many added items along with some reduced prices.

Prices are net. S.C. residents please note that you must add 7 percent tax. In the U.S., shipping is \$5 for first book and \$2.50 for each subsequent book up to \$12.50. Postage and handling charges are appreciably higher for foreign/international buyers because such shipments can only go by priority mail rate – please contact me for a postage quotation. For orders over \$500, I will pay shipping and handling charges, and for orders over \$1000, a 10 percent discount is applied.

Insurance is extra and is **STRONGLY RECOMMENDED** (\$2.50 for first \$100 and an additional \$1.25 for each subsequent \$100 in value). I have had enough problems with the USPS to come to the reluctant conclusion that insurance is very important. If a shipment which is uninsured doesn't make it, I will provide proof of shipment. My only alternative is to begin requiring insurance, charge much higher shipping, or to use UPS or FedEx. For now, I'd welcome input from you, my customers. One thing I know for sure—I can't "eat" shipments which don't get to the destination, something I've done too many times over recent years. I will retain proof of mailing but if you don't insure, you take the risk.

Unless you wish to pay for a faster rate, books are shipped via book rate through the U. S. Postal Service (USPS), and delivery generally takes seven to ten days from the date you submit your order. I try to mail orders out the day after they are received. However, if I do not respond immediately, you may want to check my schedule page on my web site. If I am out of town, please be assured that I will contact you as soon as I return.

Payment by personal check, cashier's check, money order, or through PayPal is accepted. I do not handle credit cards directly, although you can use them with a PayPal account. If you need help using PayPal, please contact PayPal Customer Service at 1-888-221-1161.

### SIR SAMUEL W. BAKER

Sir Samuel W. Baker was one of the great hunter/explorers of the Victorian era, and his personal life was as fascinating as his public one with its myriad of exploits. He was a good friend of the Prince of Wales, an immensely strong man with daredevil propensities, and a writer of great power and charm. Along with Fred Selous, I consider him the most readable of all the 19<sup>th</sup> century hunters.

### SIR RICHARD F. BURTON

Sir Richard F. Burton was without question a Renaissance man cast out of time. He spoke and wrote more than 40 languages and dialects, was a masterful explorer, a swordsman of the first water, a falconer, translator of classic Arab and Portuguese literature, was the author of scores of books, had a consuming interest in anything forbidden, and possessed a questing mind which acknowledged no boundaries and seemed singularly out of place in the staid Victorian era. He remains something of a man of mystery, and at least some of the enigma revolves around his brilliance. It was of a magnitude to pose almost impossible barriers to any and all biographers (and there have been a bunch of them).

In addition to the books listed below, I have an extensive holding—hundreds of books by and about Burton, including many rare items, I am contemplating selling. It is a collection I formed in the course of years of research on the life of this fascinating figure and in connection with a book-length bio-bibliography I wrote on him two decades ago. If you haven't read Smith, a real treat awaits you, and anyone who cherishes the history of Africa and especially the European presence in Africa will find themselves enchanted. The list which follows, while not complete, offers an extensive cross-section of his work, mostly at bargain basement prices. On the paperbacks, buy three and get the fourth one free; on the hardbacks, buy four and get the fifth one free.

Brash, bold, and fearless, Stanley was an illegitimate Welsh waif who managed, through sheer determination, to carve out a remarkable career as an explorer, public speaker, and ultimately, member of Parliament.
