Books on turkey hunting continue to appear at a pace which would have been unthinkable a quarter of a century ago. Indeed, although I haven't counted, I feel fairly certain that there have been more turkey books published in the last decade than had previously appeared in almost a century (since E. A. McIlhenny's *The Wild Turkey and Its Hunting* appeared in 1914). Here's a fully up-to-date list with dozens of new items, including plenty of unusual, scarce, or desirable ones. Where only a single copy is available, it is so noted. Also, I try to obtain signed copies of most new books on turkey hunting as they appear. If I feel a book is interesting, noteworthy, informative, or has a place in a collector's library, it will normally go into my list.

Prices are net. In the U.S., shipping is \$5 for first book and \$2.50 for each subsequent book up to \$12.50. Postage and handling charges are appreciably higher for foreign/international buyers because such shipments can only go by priority mail rate – please contact me for a postage quotation. Insurance is extra and strongly recommended (\$2.30 for first \$100 and an additional \$1.10 for each subsequent \$100 in value). Books are generally shipped USPS Book Rate. Payment by personal check, cashier's check, money order, or through PayPal.

3. Dick Alford, *Tales of the Turkey Trails*. Published in a signed, numbered edition of 105 copies, this book traces the life and activities of a man who has more than 200

birds to his credit. 200 pages, amply illustrated, and quite interesting. Paperback. Signed. \$35.

4. Dick Alford, *Wild Turkey Hunting Trifecta*. Mound, MN: No publisher or date. Paperback. Illus. New. Signed and inscribed. \$20.

5. Bill Askins (Editor), *Turkey Hunter's Guide*. Washington, DC: NRA, 1979. Paperback. 96 pp. Illus. Stories by veteran scribes such as Dalrymple, Harbour, John McDaniel and others. Unusual. \$75. One copy available.

6. Wayne Bailey, *50 Years Hunting Wild Turkey*. Delmont, PA: Penn's Woods, 1983. Paperback. [x], 132 pp. Good plus copy of a very rare book. Signed. Seldom offered. \$200.

7. Wayne Bailey, *Wayne's Turkey World: 60 Years of Hunting* (Edited with an Introduction and Bibliographical Essay by Jim Casada). Bismarck, ND: Richtman's Printing, 2002. Paperback. xxxiv, 168 pp. Illus. A well-written and eminently informative work by one of the sports true pioneers as a hunter and a biologist. I'll inscribe and sign if you desire. \$16.

8. Wayne Bailey and K. T. Rinell, *West Virginia Wild Turkey*. Charleston, WV: WV DNR, 1968. Paperback. x, 60 pp. Illus., bibliog. Signed. Extremely rare and important. Bailey says "this is the work of which I am proudest." Very fine. \$100.

9. Horatio Bigelow, *Gunnerman's Gold*. Huntington, WV: Standard Publications, 1943. xvi, 128 pages. Illustrated. Limited, numbered edition of 1000 copies bound in attractive maroon buckram with gold lettering on front and spine. Fine. Lacks dust jacket, as is almost always the case with this book. Covers various upland sports including turkey hunting. Quite rare. \$135.

9A. Horatio Bigelow, *Gunnerman*. NY: Derrydale Press, 1939. Xxii, 246 pages. Illus. No. 201 of a limited, numbered edition of 950 copies. Generally fine (slight tape ghosts to first inside blank page). Tight and bright copy of a book in what is probably the most important sporting series ever published in America. Includes much turkey hunting material. \$210. **SOLD.**

9B. Horatio Bigelow, *Gunnerman* (with a Foreword by Col. Harold P. Sheldon). NY: Derrydale Press, 1939. Hardbound (lovely red buckram with gold trim). No. 398 of a numbered, limited edition of 950 copies. xxii, 246 pages. Illustrated. Very good, with a rather messy gluing job for a previous owner's bookplate and slight fading to the spine keeping it from being fine. A dandy book from the best-known of all American sporting publishers. Not all turkey hunting but multiple chapters devoted exclusively to the sport and mention of it in others. Also, there are two chapters devoted to coverage of the author's acquaintance with and visit to Archibald Rutledge's Hampton Plantation. An immensely readable, rare, and generally overlooked book. \$195.

10. Holly Bine, *Turkey Hunter's Pocket Manual*. New Martinsville, WV: Fonner Printing, 1991. 44 pp. A useful, informative little work from an experienced hunter. Out

of print, missing from most collections, and the author tells me all copies are gone. Paperback. Fair with tape mark to front. Signed. \$25. Only one copy available.

11. Rick Black, *The Wild Turkey Cookbook*. Wever, IA: Black Iron Cookin' Co., 2003. Comb bound (lies flat, which is what you want in a cookbook). 132 pages plus pp. 133-52 comprised of ads. Includes some oddball pieces of narrative but is mostly turkey recipes (and a few for veggies). Useful and practical. \$10.

12. Gerry Blair, *Turkey Hunting with Gerry Blair*. Iola, WI: Krause Publications, 1991. Hardback. 280 pp. Illus. Insight from an old-time hunter who was associated in various editorial capacities with *Turkey Hunter* and *Turkey & Turkey Hunting* magazines. As new. \$20.

A history of the bridges family of the famed Woodmont Rod & Gun Club. Includes a great deal of information on turkey hunting, correspondence with Archibald Rutledge, and more. This is the story of the Woodmont Rod & Gun Club and Bridges' earnest but unsuccessful efforts to pursue turkey restoration. \$130. Only one copy available.

This self-published book is extremely rare and this copy is the first one I've had on offer in a number of years. In fine condition would bring \$750 to \$1000.
